Be careful about assuming debt, and do consider the impact of your decisions on cash flow and your compensation.

## **Anticipate Changes in Your Practice Culture and Decision-making**

What impact will the expansion have on the culture of your practice and especially on your role? How will things be, and feel different? Are you prepared for how the dynamics of the practice will change?

## **Consider the Impact on Your Reputation and Relationships**

Your roles in your practice and with your community are relationships. As you expand your practice, consider how these will change. How do you plan to deepen connections and avoid ruptures?

In short, be careful about what you wish for. Even positive changes lead to stress, as well as new challenges. Consider making "bite-sized" changes, rather than major changes all at once. See what works and expand on it, and be willing to pivot to adjust to unanticipated consequences.
